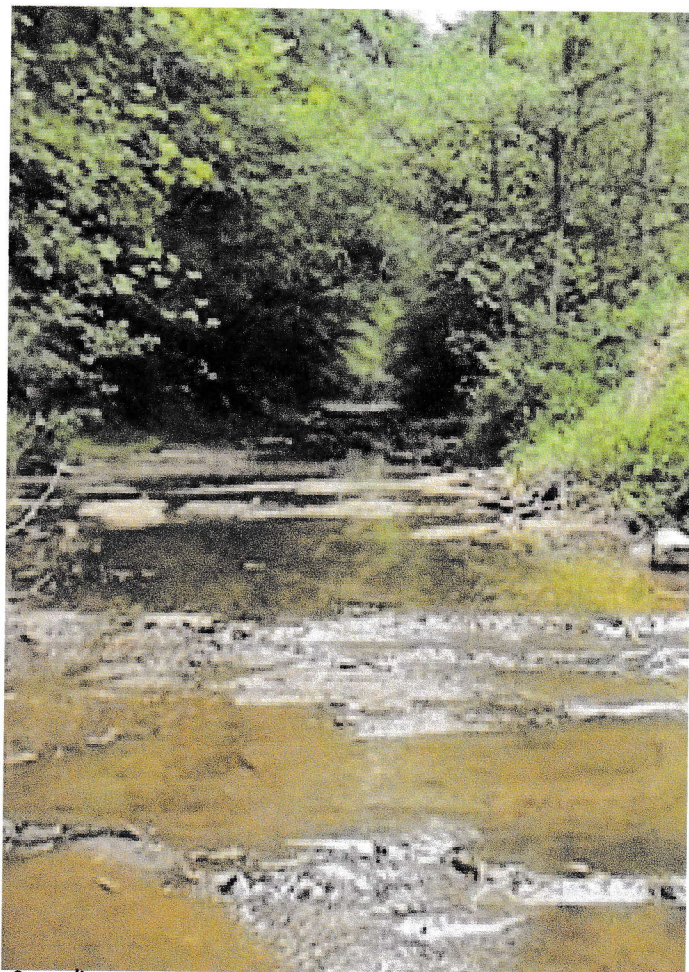


Orange County, Virginia, Judgment execution bundles, from abt 1727

G EORGE the Second, by the Grace of God, of Great-Britain,
 France, and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, &c. To the Sher-
 iff of Orange County, Greeting. We command you,
 that you take John Pendergrass
 if he — be found within your Bailiwick, and him — safely keep, so
 that you have his — Body before the Justices of our said
 County Court, at the Court-house of the said County, on the fourth
Thursday in April next — to satisfy William Russell
 the sum of one Pound seven Shillings & Eleven pence
 half penny current money which of said William Russell
 by a Judgment of our said Court hath recovered against
 him by Petition a some hundred & eight pounds of ^{the} Tobacco
 which to the said William in the same Court were adjudged
 for his costs by him about his suit in that behalf expen-
 ed —

whereof the said John Pendergrass is — convict, as appears to us, of
 Record. And have then there this Writ. Witness John Nicholas
 Clerk of our said Court, at the said Court-house, the XXVIIIth
 Day of January — in the twenty first Year of our Reign.

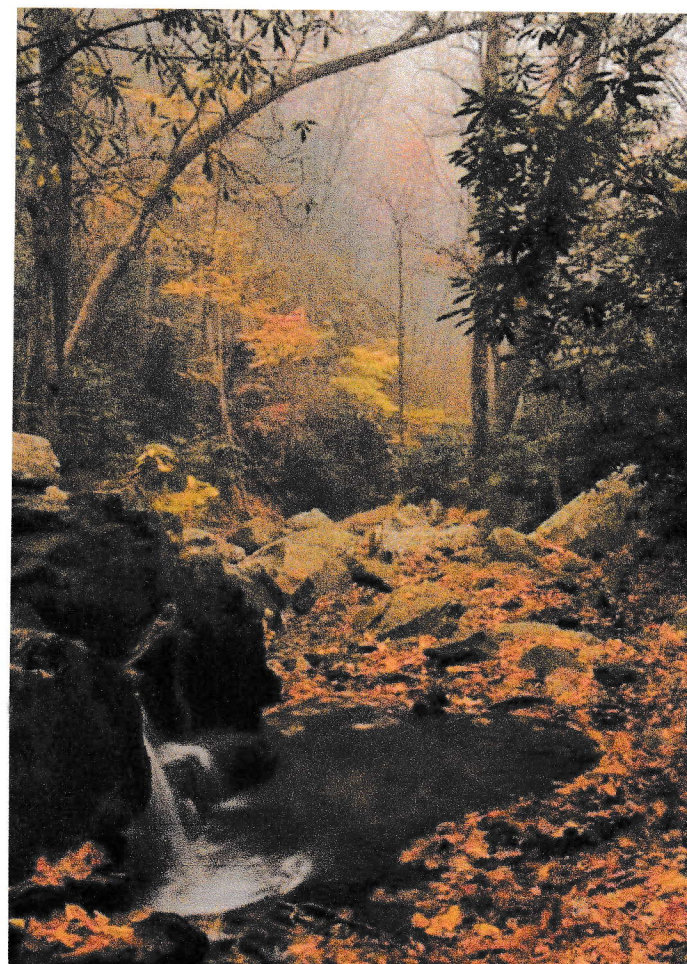

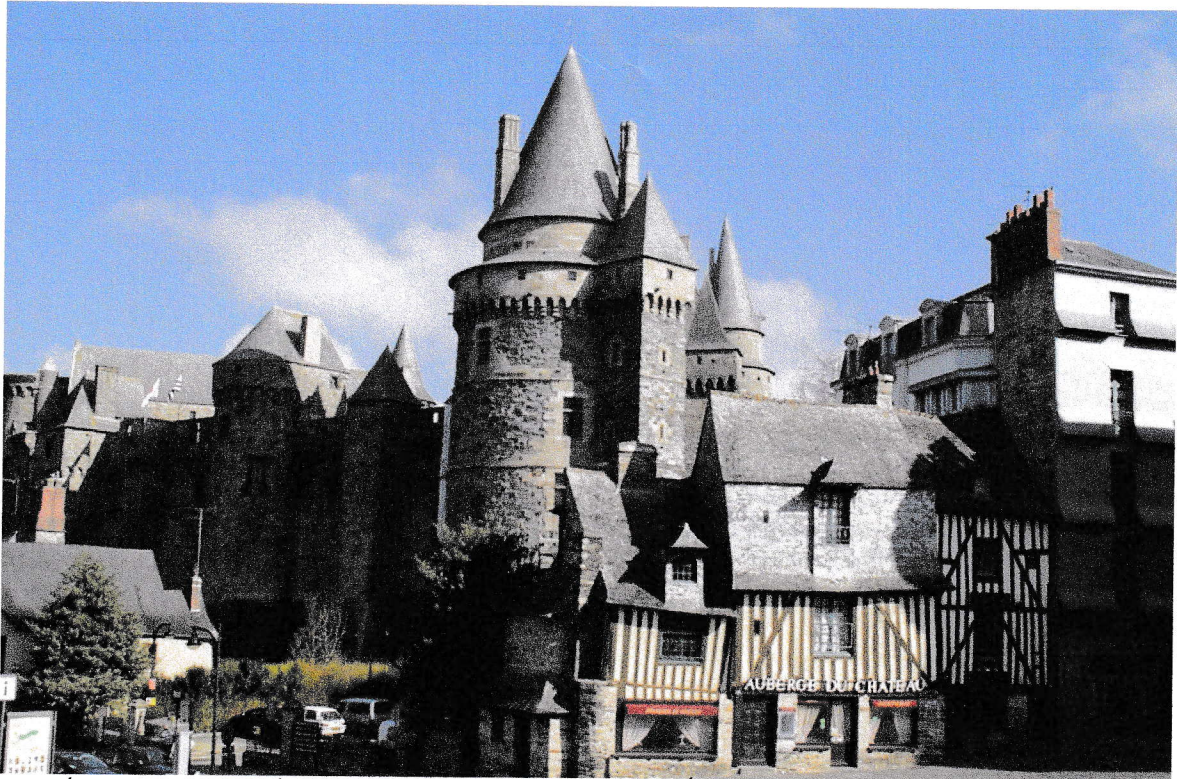

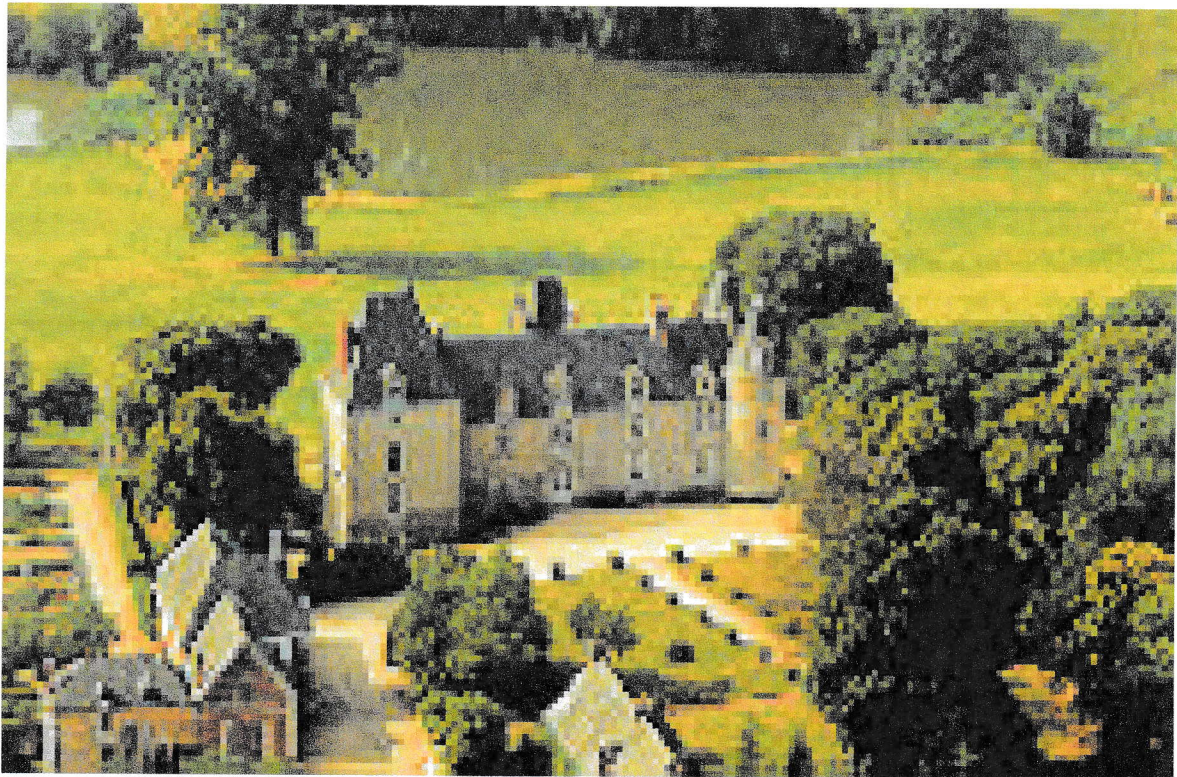
Château Vitré, Bretagne, France, town where Perrine Pivert, wife of Philippe de la Renaudière was born.



Yates Mill, (Grist), Raleigh, North Carolina



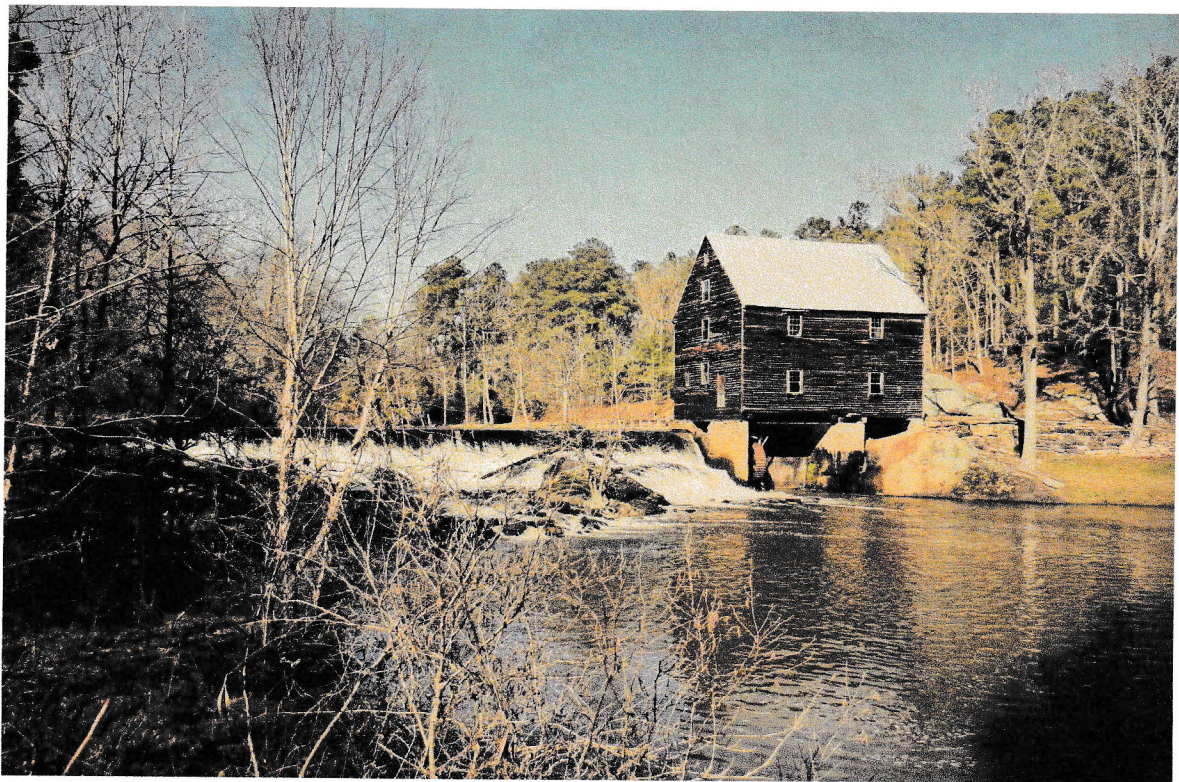
Bunn, Bennett Plantation very near the 100 acres in the northeast corner of Wake Co, N. C. that "Wake" John and Hannah bought in 1789



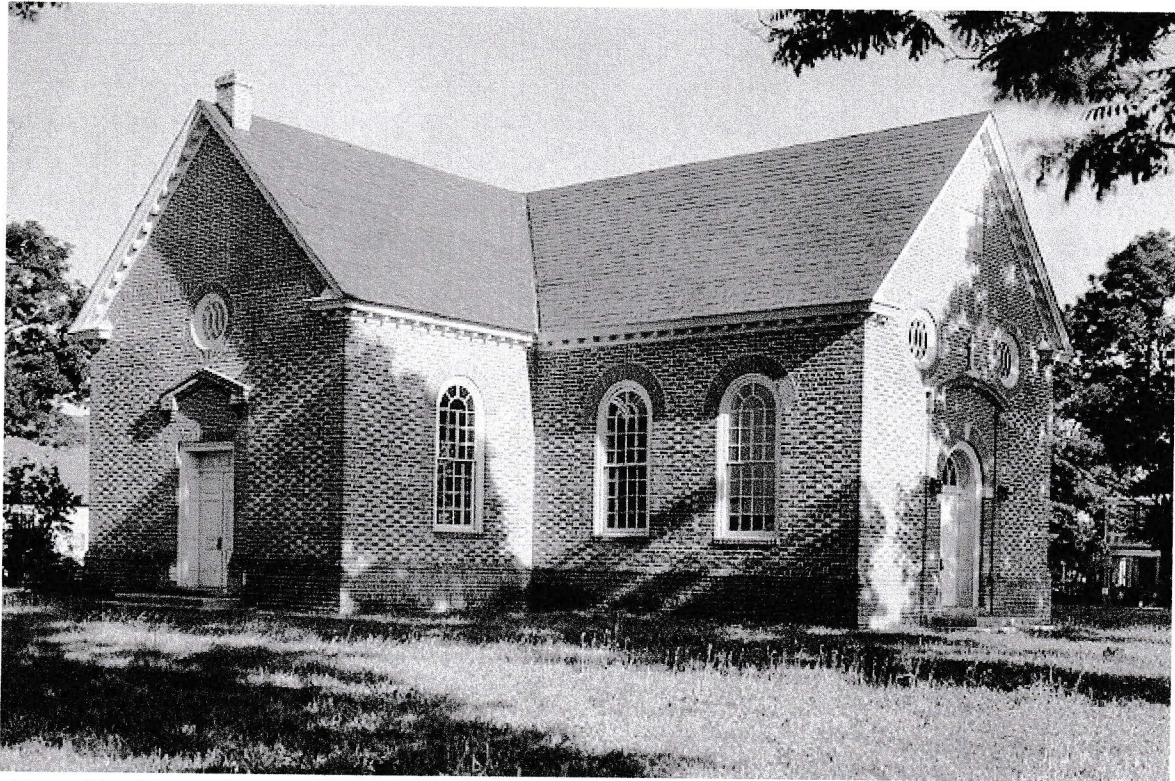
Château de la Renaudière, Neuvy-en-Champagne, Loire Valley

Château de la Renaudière is connected to Philippe de la Renaudière.



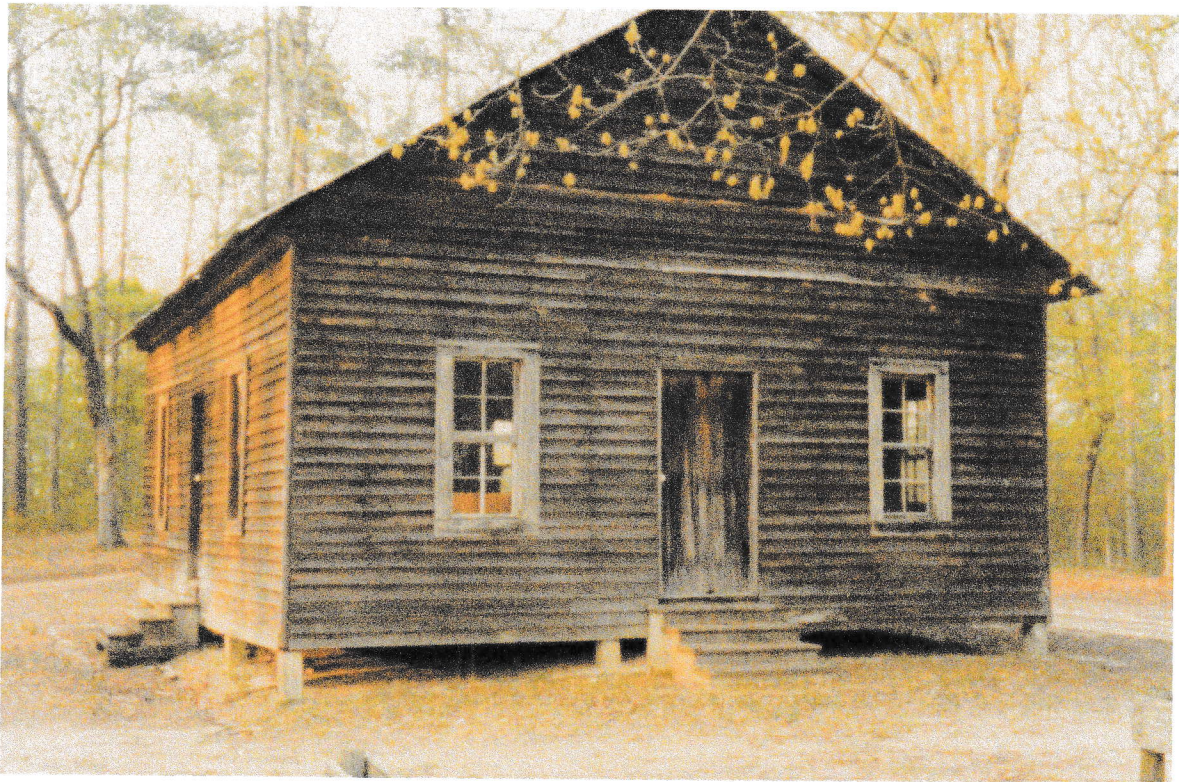

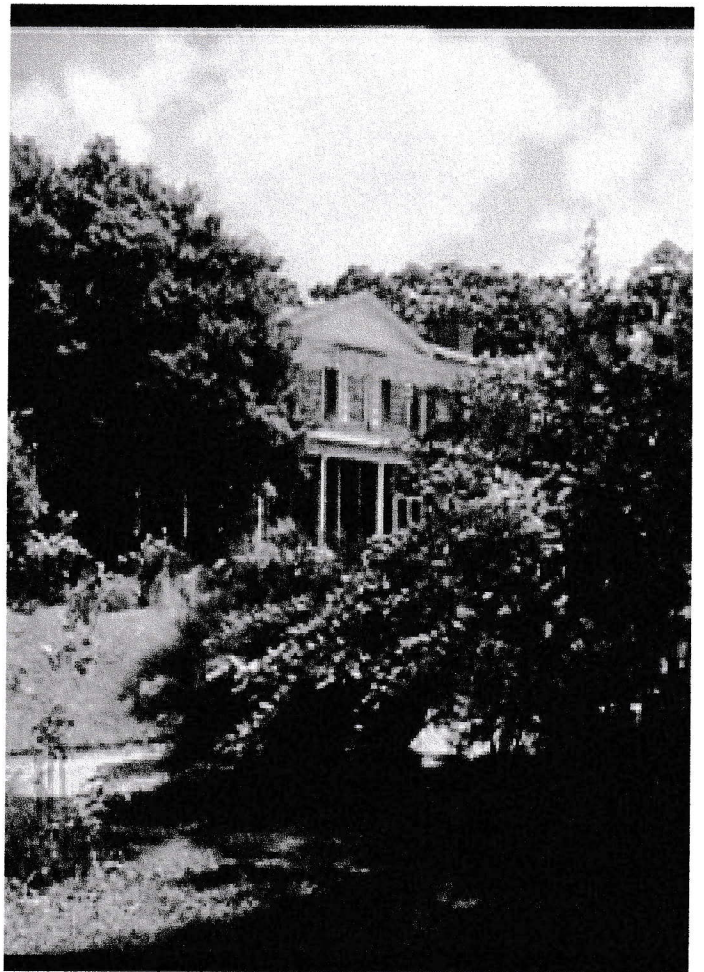
